

- Partnership to provide professional development and general expertise to support a hands-on Science Studio in Ramallah
- Foundation had the foresight to focus first on developing staff and local capacity rather than physical exhibits or a building
- Workshops in Ramallah and extended residencies for exhibit developers at the Exploratorium in San Francisco
- Science Studio and new Cultural Foundation Center have opened
- Horizons greatly broadened for all of us





UCSF Benioff Children's

- 16 custom exhibits and teacher its ibnal development for the new campus of a premier children's research hospital
- Challenging new type of environment for exhibit development with unique goals and critical constraints
- Worked in close partnership with experienced hospital staff to achieve excellent results based on feedback from patients, families and staff
- Horizons broadened from workbench to bedside





Street Smarts: Experiments in Urban Social Science

- NSF research grant to design exhibit experiences that prompt observation and foster empathy for the social experience of others
- Outdoor installation in front of San Francisco City Hall to serve very diverse audiences: homeless, city officials, library/museum visitors, etc.
- Multiple city agencies, neighborhood groups, and stakeholders
- Key finding: facilitators with street "cred" and sense of ownership
- Currently prototyping onsite for final installation next summer; definitely broadening our horizons and reaching new audiences
